Ukrainian Language Classes

February 27th - June 14th, 2019

There are currently three levels of Ukrainian language classes being taught, Beginner I, Beginner II, and Intermediate I. These classes began in September and will wrap up at the end of January.

Mohyla Institute began offering Ukrainian language classes in January of 2017 and we now offer a variety of classes twice per year. We are happy to announce our next slate of Ukrainian language classes beginning in February of 2019.

We will be offering three separate classes, course offerings depend on level of interest. All classes have limited spaces available and require a minimum of 8 registrants to run.

- Intermediate I
- Intermediate II
- Youth

If the youth class does not have enough registrants to run, the youth will be placed in the appropriate class level. A brief questionnaire will be administered to determine class placement.



Thank you to everyone who attended, sponsored a hole, and donated prizes. It was a great day!


